STREET SWEEPING



Listed below is Cleona's street sweeping schedule for April through July 2017. We need your assistance for this program to be effective! Please have your car off the street by 7:00am the day of your scheduled street sweeping. **As a reminder our street sweeping schedule starts the second Monday of each month.** Our Public Work's team is also working by inspecting storm drains and monitoring the streets, picking up debris to keep our streams and streets looking beautiful. You can help your Borough Public Work's Department by keeping your curb line clear of debris and weeds.

STREET LIGHTS

If you notice a street light is out or working intermittently, please notify the Borough office. Before calling the office, please note the pole number which can be found on the yellow strip around the pole, the location of the pole and if the light is completely out or working intermittently. Thank you in advance for helping us keep our streets safe at night.

KEEPING OUR BOROUGH BEAUTIFUL

Now that Spring has finally decided to stay, we have many residents walking, biking and enjoying the outdoors. We have received complaints in the Borough office of dogwalkers not cleaning up after their pets. Please carry a bag to clean up after your dog and dispose of the bag properly. Please keep all trash in receptacles that are water tight, with a tight cover and in good condition. Grass should be kept at a maximum of 6" in height and never blown into the street. Keeping your property tidy and free of rubbish prevents rodents from inhabiting your property as well as your neighbor's property. To help you dispose of unwanted items, the Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority has a list of things that can be recycled on their website, www.gogla.org. For the aesthetics of the Borough, please do not store items that need to be discarded outside for any extended period of time.

The Borough has made arrangements with North Cornwall for disposal of green waste. Acceptable items include tree branches (up to 5 inches in diameter), shrubs, twigs, garden materials, weeds, hedge clippings, flowers, plants, ornamental grass (tall & straw-like) and root systems free of dirt. Grass clippings, sod, thatch, fruits and vegetables from trees or plants are not acceptable. Residents who wish to participate will need to come into the Borough office to obtain a residency verification form before proceeding to North Cornwall Township. An annual permit costs \$30.00. A \$5.00 deposit is required for first issuance of a key card (refundable at the end of the calendar year with return of the card) or you may use the "Pay-As-You-Go" method of \$4.00 per bag or container at each arrival. Hours of operation are as follows: April 1st-September 30; Monday through Saturday 7:00am-7:00pm and Sunday 10:00-7:00pm. October 1st-March 31; Monday through Saturday 7:00am-5:00pm and Sunday 10:00am-5:00pm. North Cornwall Township is located at 320 South 18th Street. Office hours are Monday through Friday from 7:00am-3:30pm.

STREETS

Sam Wengert, Councilman in charge of Streets, is preparing a short and long term plan for repair and overlaying of the streets in the Borough. Part of this plan is curb and sidewalk replacement. In the coming months, we will be busy going throughout the Borough notifying residents of any curbs or sidewalks that the resident will need to have replaced. The Public Work's Department has started to work on pot holes that developed over the winter months. Please notify the Borough office of existing pot holes that need attention.

CLEONA FIRE COMPANY #1 NEWS

To better serve Cleona residents and our neighboring communities, the Fire Company, an all-volunteer organization, ordered a new Pierce Fire Engine. The old engine will be sold to off-set the cost with Borough Council agreeing to assist in payment of the loans. To outfit one fire fighter the cost is over \$3,000.00 and does not include the cost of required training. As the Fire Company prepares for the Spring fund raiser they would like to thank the people in the community for their past support in training and equipping our fire fighters with the tools needed to address safety and emergency issues.
