LET IT SNOW, LET IT SNOW, LET IT SNOW!

We are once again in that season of white! We wanted to bring several items to your attention in case you are new to the Borough.

1.) **NEVER THROW/SNOWBLOW SNOW INTO THE STREET.** Ordinance #271 prohibits anyone to throw/dump *anything* in the streets, culverts, catch basins or within 20 feet of a fire hydrant. All residents could be subject to a citation for this offense, and the possibility of having to reimburse the Borough for the costs associated with both snow removal and any attorney fees associated with prosecution.

2.) **REMOVAL OF SNOW/ICE FROM SIDEWALKS WITHIN 24 HOURS AFTER THE SNOWFALL OR ICE STORM.** Ordinance #223 calls for snow/ice removal within 24 hours after the end of the storm/snowfall. Please be aware that this is enforced due to safety concerns for everyone within the Borough and helps to limit people having to walk in the street to have a safe path.

3.) **ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT** To aid and assist the Cleona Fire Company, we are asking all residents that have a fire hydrant located on or near their property to remove all snow around the hydrant. This will assist the Fire Company with being able to respond quicker in case of an emergency and save them the added time of having to shovel out a fire hydrant. Please help save your house and make the Fire Company's response time that much faster. While we hope it never happens, those extra seconds could save a life.

CLEONA BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Farneski and Sergeant Rager procured a drug box for all Cleona Borough residents. Unwanted prescription drugs may be brought to the Borough office during office hours to safely dispose of the unwanted items. Please visit their Facebook page for items that are not allowed or call the Borough office. NEVER flush them down the toilet.

Chief Farneski has an agreement with Rite Aid to pick up prescription medications for delivery to Cleona residents in case of an emergency or COVID quarantining keeps you at home. Please contact the Police Department at the number below if you require our assistance with getting your medication.

The Borough Authority has been very busy with storm water projects and a new force main for sanitary sewer. The Authority meets the first Wednesday of each month and welcomes any resident to attend their meeting. STREET SWEEPING



Listed below is Cleona's tentative street sweeping schedule for March through June, 2021. For this program to be effective, ***please have your car off the street by 7:00am the day of your scheduled street sweeping.*** As a reminder our street sweeping schedule starts the second Monday of each month except for March. Please set your phone/tablet with a reminder to move your vehicle off the street on your scheduled day. You can also help the Borough keep the storm drains clean by keeping your curb line clear of debris and weeds.

KEEPING OUR BOROUGH BEAUTIFUL

According to the Borough's Ordinance, all rubbish/garbage MUST be contained in a garbage receptacle made of metal or plastic with a watertight cover. Items to be disposed of that cannot be picked up by your regular trash hauler should NOT be stored outside. This not only keeps our Borough looking beautiful but helps keep rodents and other "critters" away from your property. There is a once-a-year hazardous material pick-up and a free electronic recycling program sponsored by the Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority. More recycling information may be obtained by going to their website, gogla.org. The Borough has an agreement with North Cornwall for green waste disposal as well.
